



The Southern Cochlear Implant Programme (SCIP) provides cochlear implant services in the South Island and lower half of the North Island of New Zealand. We undertake a mix of publicly and privately funded services. We provide implants to 40+ new recipients each year with support for more than 800 existing recipients.

Our main clinic is based in Christchurch at St. George's Hospital in Papanui but we also operate a site in Lower Hutt. We currently have a vacancy for a full-time Audiologist in our Christchurch Centre.

Due to staff vacancy we have a need for a full-time Audiologist in our rooms at St. George's Hospital in Christchurch.

Cochlear implant experience is desirable but not essential as full training will be provided.

Previous work in a public health setting would be beneficial. Broad experience working with a range of clients would be an advantage.

The Service

We provide comprehensive services to children and adults with cochlear implants:

- Pre-implant candidacy assessment
- Routine switch-on and MAPping in clinic
- Evaluation of post-implant outcomes
- In-service training and support of other professionals working with CI
- Research

The clinic also operates a children's Habilitation service and Audiology staff work collaboratively as part of a team.

The Role

This is a full time clinical role working with both children and adults.

The position is based in our Christchurch rooms.

We also run visiting clinics and the successful applicant would be expected to under-take some travel as part of this service.

The Rewards

This is a rewarding role where Audiology intervention has life-changing benefits.

Care is for the life-course and there is the opportunity to see clients grow and progress over time.

The Person

You will have a minimum of 2 years clinical practice in both diagnostic and rehabilitative settings.

You must be legally entitled to work in New Zealand.

The successful candidate will have excellent foundation Audiology skills and experience working in a multi-disciplinary team environment with a range of health and education professionals.

The programme employs a mix of clinical staff to deliver its clinical services:

- 4.3 FTE Audiology staff
- 4 FTE Habilitation staff
- 1.4 FTE Rehabilitation staff

Previous work in a public health setting would be an advantage.

The successful candidate will be a member of the New Zealand Audiological Society (NZAS), or be eligible for full membership. An NZAS paediatric certificate would be an advantage.
