

Clinical Audiologist – Cochlear Implants



The Southern Cochlear Implant Programme (SCIP) provides cochlear implant services under contract to the Ministry of Health in the South Island and lower half of the North Island of New Zealand. We currently provide implants to 40+ new recipients each year and continue to support more than 900 existing recipients

With growth in clinical services in our Lower Hutt clinic, we are interested in employing a further Audiologist. We are looking for someone in a full-time role but consideration would be given to someone wanting a part-time position. We can be flexible to work in with your other commitments if necessary.

The Role

We provide comprehensive services to children and adults with cochlear implants:

- Pre-implant candidacy assessment
- Routine switch-on and MAPping in clinic
- Evaluation of post-implant outcomes
- In-service training and support of other professionals working with CI recipients such as Audiologists, Teachers-of-the-Deaf, ENT Surgeons, and Hearing Therapists
- Visiting clinical services to the regions 2-3 times per year
- There may be opportunities for research.
- The clinic also operates a children's Habilitation service and Audiology staff work collaboratively as part of a team.

Cochlear implant experience is highly desirable but for the right candidate we can provide full training.

Previous work in a public health setting would be beneficial. Broad experience working with a range of clients would be an advantage.

The role involves working with both children and adults.

You would be expected to travel to our Christchurch clinic for induction, training, and clinical meetings from time-to-time.
