

Clinical Audiologists

Opportunity to join our Wellington Clinic or our Christchurch Clinic



The Southern Cochlear Implant Programme (SCIP) provides cochlear implant services under contract to the Ministry of Health in the South Island and lower half of the North Island of New Zealand. We currently provide implants to 80+ new recipients each year and continue to support more than 1,200 existing recipients.

With growth in clinical services, we are looking to employ an additional Audiologist in both our Christchurch clinic and our Wellington (Lower Hutt) clinic. Whilst these are full-time roles, consideration may be given to someone with previous cochlear implant experience interested in a part-time position.

The Role

Audiologists provide comprehensive services to children and adults with cochlear implants in the following areas:

- Pre-implant candidacy assessment
- Routine switch-on and MAPping in clinic
- Evaluation of post-implant outcomes
- In-service training and support of other professionals working with CI recipients (Audiologists, Teachers-of-the-Deaf, ENT Surgeons, and Hearing Therapists)
- Visiting clinical services to the regions several times per year
- Telehealth service delivery
- Work collaboratively as part of a team with Habilitationists and Rehabilitationists.

Cochlear implant experience is highly desirable, however we can provide full training. Previous work in a public health setting is beneficial.

The Wellington role may be expected to travel to our Christchurch clinic for induction, training, and clinical meetings from time-to-time.

Position Requirements

- Applicants must be full members of the New Zealand Audiological Society (MNZAS)
- Applicants must be able to travel as required
- Applicants must be entitled to work in New Zealand
